Ask patient's preference about taking medication: by hand, in a cup, one pill at a time, or all at once <br> c. If medication falls on the floor, discard it appropriately and administer a new one. <br> d. When pouring liquid medication, set the cup on flat surface and read the level of liquid at the lowest point of meniscus. Palm the label of the bottle. <br> e. Remain with patient and verify each medication has been swallowed <br> f. Dispose of used equipment |  |  |  |
