- 1. Attend the Associate Degree Nursing Advising Session. You must attend an advising session within 12 months of application to the nursing program...You MUST attend an advising session prior to the application deadline for which you are seeking admission and between 5/30/23 and 5/30/24.
 - 2. Fill out the <u>College of DuPage General Admission</u>

 <u>Application</u> online. If you have previously or currently attend COD, you may omit this step.

- To ensure that all your eligible credits are evaluated towards the admission requirements, turn in all official transcripts from any schools that you have attended. Please follow the steps listed below:

The item of proof must demonstrate that the student lived in an in-district address for at least 30 days prior to the application deadline date. Email the form along with 1 proof of residency to the Office of Student Registration Services by the program application deadline date.

Note: If the Residency Verification form and 1 proof of residency have *not* been submitted to the Office of Student Registration by the program application deadline date, the applicant will not be considered for admission.

- 6. Complete academic coursework requirements by the admission deadline. In order to qualify for the Associate Degree in Nursing Program, the applicant must have a cumulative GPA of 2.75 or higher. This includes required prerequisite and general education coursework for the Associates degree. Admissions will continue to review applicants until all seats have been filled. Admission is not guaranteed, and all admission criteria must be met.
 - ANATOMY & PHYSIOLOGY: <u>Anatomy and Physiology</u>
 1551/1571 and 1552/1572 or equivalent with a grade of "C" or better. Both courses must be completed between May
 30th, 2019 May 30th, 2024 for Fall 2024 admission.
 - MICROBIOLOGY: MICRO 1420 or equivalent with a grade of "C" or better.
 - MATH: MATH 1102*, or higher, with a grade of "C" or better with the exception of Math 1104, 1120, and 1340.

Recommended: Completion of an approved statistics course is recommended if your intentions are to continue your education for a BSN or MSN, i.e. MATH 1635; PSYCH 2280, SOCIO- 2205.

Note: This test can be retaken 30 days after the first attempt, BUT only 3 times within a calendar year (January 1 – December 31 current year).

ELSEVIER/EVOLVE A2 EXAM REQUIREMENTS

- Applicants must achieve a cumulative score score of 75%.
- A minimum score of 65% is required in the following HESI subject areas:
 - Vocabulary
 - Reading
 - Math
- A minimum score of 70% is required in the HESI subject area of Anatomy & Physiology.
- All scores must be achieved in a single test.

ELSEVIER/EVOLVE A2 EXAM REQUIREMENTS

- This admission HESI test must be taken within 2 years of the application deadline.
- There will be no rounding of scores.
- Additional rank points will be offered based on the following:
 - 4 points if 3 or more areas > 90%
 - 3 points if 2 areas ≥ 90%
 - 2 points if 3 or more areas ≥ 80%
 - 1 point if 2 areas ≥ 80%

- In the event, that there are MORE qualified applicants than there are seats available for this program, a ranking process will be used based on the Admission Requirements.

ACCEPTANCE PROCESS (CONT)

Priority for admission:

- a. In-district applicants
- b. Out-of-District who are part of the CAREER Consortium Agreement (meaning your residing community college does not offer the particular program in which you are applying)
- c. Out-of-District applicants working full-time indistrict (proof of in-district employment will be required each semester)
- d. Out-of-District applicants (who are not part of the CAREER Consortium Agreement) including those students with a joint or chargeback agreement and International students

- Accepted list
- Alternate list
- Program full
- Denied

APPLICATION DECISIONS

 Notification letters will be sent after the Nursing Department has calculated rank scores and the Nursing Department Director of Nursing and Program Chairs have confirmed the applicants that will be accepted. This is typically about 1 month after the application deadline.

SOMETHING TO CONSIDER...

- In order to be eligible to begin the ADN program, you must have a background check with no findings.
- If you have a history of a felony conviction, you will not be eligible to participate in the ADN program.
- If you have a misdemeanor on your record, you need to have it expunged prior to admittance into the program; this will affect your clinical placement and may impede your ability to obtain a nursing license.
