Students must complete the following Registration Check List to be granted permission to register for the Surgical Technology Program.

NOTE: Admission Committees for all Health Science programs has the right to deny admission to any applicant that they feel is unable to fulfill the essential functions as described.

 2. If you have not been admitted to College of DuPage, please complete the **non-refundable \$20** [College of DuPage General Admissions Application](#) online. **This application is for general admissions to College of DuPage only.**
 3. Create your myAccess account. (Your COD ID number is provided in your “Welcome” email):

 - a. After creating your myAccess account, all communications will come to your COD email account. Set up your COD email: cod.edu/email
 4. To ensure that all of your eligible credits are evaluated towards the registration requirements, turn in ALL official Transcripts from institutions that you have attended. Immediately:
 - Submit your official transcript(s) to College of DuPage, [Office of Student Records](#). If College of DuPage is the only institution you have attended, you do not need to request official transcripts.
 - Verify receipt of your transcript(s). Log into myACCESS account, click on ‘myACCESS for Students’, select ‘My Profile’. The receipt status of your transcript will be listed under ‘Transcript Institutions’.
- *NOTE: If you have an international transcript from high school or college, it must be evaluated. Please visit the following website https://www.cod.edu/registration/records/trans_eval_listing.aspx for details.
5. Contact Health Program Advisors for education plan. To schedule a phone appointment, contact the Counseling, Advising, and Transfer Center at 630-942-2259, Monday-Thursday, 8am-7pm and Friday, 8am-5 pm. Leave a message with your name, student ID, phone number and a brief reason for the appointment. Someone will get back to you, usually within a few hours to book an appointment.

6. Students must successfully complete the following courses (or equivalencies) with a “C” or better, before granted approval of SURGT1101 registration:

- a. English (3 credits)
- b. Math-1000 level or above (3 credits)
- c. Anatomy & Physiology (4 credits) *Within 7 years
- d. ORPCT1001 (5 credits) *Within 5 years
- e. CSPD1111 (4 credits) *Within 5 years
- f. SURGT1000 (3 credits) *Within 5 years
- g. Speech (3 credits)
- h. Humanities (3 credits)
- i. Social & Behavioral Science (3 credits)
- j. Multicultural/Global Studies (3 credits) *Recommend Biomedical Terminology

7. Contact Surgical Technology Program Chair, Anna Campbell at campbella86@cod.edu, at any time throughout your studies for assistance with the registration process. However, you must contact Anna no later than December 17th, 2022 for evaluation of transcripts and permission to register for the program. After email is received, the student’s transcripts will be reviewed. If all courses are successfully complete, the student will be granted permission to register. Students will be notified through their COD email.

24 students will be granted permission to register for a Spring 2023 start on a first come first serve basis. If the 24 student maximum has been reached, **and it is confirmed that you have met all pre-Registration requirements**, the student will immediately be granted permission to register for the 2024 surgical technology program.

8. The **Registration Deadline** for this program is **December 17, 2022**. **This program is based on full completion of requirements** and is a **first-come, first-serve** registration process. Once you have completed the steps above, you will be notified via email that you have permission to register. Please continue to monitor your email for instructions.
9. **Once given permission to register**, please email the Registration Office at registration@cod.edu or call them at (630) 942-2237 in order to officially register for the Surgical Technology program course: SURGT 1101.
10. After registration, students will receive the Surgical Technology Program Student Handbook. The handbook must read thoroughly, important information such as text book and supply requirements are noted.

Program Overview

The Surgical Technology program begins every January and runs three consecutive semesters with a December graduation date. Each semester includes classroom, lab, and clinical experiences. Lecture is held all year using in class and online formats. Lab runs the entire spring semester, and includes all required skills for functioning in the operating room. Clinical begins second semester and continues through graduation. The clinical sites are selected for the student, requests are not granted and students must provide their own transportation to and from the institution. Please note, students may have to travel up to an hour for their clinical rotation. Information about a career in Surgical Technology is available at: www.ast.org or www.SurgicalTechSuccess.com.

Essential Functions

You may be exposed to fumes, chemicals, cold, noise, radiation, blood/body fluids and infectious diseases while working as a surgical technologist. Please look carefully at the following Essential Functions for the operating room. These are physical, mental, and emotional characteristics that are required for employment in the operating room. Only you can decide if this career is right for you. It is better to recognize if a program is a right fit before committing to a career. Once admitted into the program, students are expected to comply with the rules, regulations and procedures of College of DuPage and the affiliated clinical hospital sites. *Non-compliance with rules, regulations and procedures is a basis for **dismissal** from the program. The Health and Sciences Program Standards for Professional Conduct is available upon request and will be presented to the students upon their acceptance into the program.*

Gross Motor Skills:

- Move within confined spaces
- Maintain balance in multiple positions
- Reach above shoulders (e.g., adjust overhead lights)
- Reach below waist (e.g., plug electrical appliance into wall outlet)
- Reach out front

Fine Motor Skills:

- Pick up objects with hands
- Grasp small objects with hands firm and slight pressure (ex. surgical instruments, sutures)
- Write with pen or pencil
- Key/type (e.g., use a computer)
- Pinch/pick or otherwise work with fingers (e.g., manipulate a syringe)
- Twist (e.g., turn objects/knobs using hands)
- Squeeze with finger (e.g., eye dropper)
- Manual dexterity
- Finger dexterity
- Simultaneous use of hands, wrists, fingers
- Coordinate eye-hand and eye-hand foot (e.g., pumping soap dispenser and surgical scrub)

Physical Endurance:

- Stand for long periods of time from 2-4 hours
- Maintain same position for long periods of time
- Sustained repetitive movements
- Function in a fast-paced work environment for hours

Physical Strength:

- Push and pull 50 pounds (e.g., carry instrument pans, position client, move equipment)
- Support 50 pounds of weight (e.g., hold arm or leg)
- Lift 50 pounds (e.g., pick up a child, transfer client, bend to lift an infant or child)
- Carry equipment/supplies (e.g., lift instrument pans)
- Use upper body strength (e.g., retraction, physically restrain a client)
- Squeeze with hands (e.g., operate fire extinguishers)

Hearing:

- Ability to hear normal speaking level sounds (e.g., person to person conversation, request for an instrument)
- Hear faint voices and body sounds (e.g., heartbeat)
- Ability to discriminate speech in presence of background noises
- Hear in situations when not able to see lips (e.g., masks are worn in the operating room)

Visual:

- See objects up to 20 inches away (e.g., information on monitor screen, identification of small needles)
- See objects up to 20 feet away
- Use depth perception
- Use peripheral vision
- Distinguish color and color intensity (e.g., color codes on supplies)
- See in darkened room (e.g., during endoscope procedures, eye surgery)

Environment:

- Tolerate exposure to allergens (e.g., latex gloves, chemical substances)
- Tolerate strong soaps
- Tolerate strong odors
- Exposure and tolerate unpleasant sights and sounds, electrical energy, solvents, grease, oils, slippery or uneven walking surfaces and excessive noises
- Tolerate working in confined spaces for extended periods of time
- Tolerate wearing protective equipment (e.g., mask, gown, gloves, glasses, laser, radiation)
- Tolerate working indoors
- Tolerate working in extreme temperatures

Emotional Stability:

- Establish professional relationships
- Adapt to changing environment/stress
- Deal with the unexpected (e.g., client condition, crisis)
- Focus attention on task
- Cope with own emotions
- Perform multiple responsibilities concurrently
- Cope with strong emotions in others (e.g., grief, anger, stress)
- Accept constructive feedback
- Accept responsibility for own actions

Interpersonal Skills:

- Establish rapport with individuals (e.g., surgeons, staff members and groups)
- Respect/value diversity in others
- Negotiate interpersonal conflict
- Demonstrate tolerance in working with others
- Function as part of a team

Accreditation

College of DuPage is accredited by the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools (NCA-HLC), The Higher Learning Commission.

Program Mission Statement

The primary purpose of the Surgical Technology program is to educate students with didactic, laboratory, and clinical experiences in preparation to take the national certification exam and work as a professional surgical technologist. Program policies and procedures have been designed to meet or exceed those established by The Commission on Accreditation of Allied Health Education Program (CAAHEP) (www.caahep.org/) and the Accreditation Review Council on Education in Surgical Technology and Surgical Assisting (ARCST/SA) (www.arcstsa.org). The graduate will demonstrate competency to meet national certification requirements, provide skills that meet standard in patient care, and function as an essential member of the health care and operating room team with knowledge and skilled competence.

Program Goals and Outcomes

The College of DuPage Surgical Technology Program curriculum incorporates accredited professional standards, guidelines, and competencies from the following concepts:

- Patient-Centered Care: Surgical technologists will offer excellent, compassionate care for all patients, regardless of race, gender, religion, disability, or background.
- Safety: Surgical Technologists will ensure the operating room environment is safe, equipment functions properly, and that the operative procedure is conducted under conditions that maximize patient safety.
- Professionalism: The Surgical Technologist will consistently practice in accordance with professional, legal, and ethical standards.
- Aseptic Technique: The Surgical Technologist must rigorously adhere to the practices and procedures that prevent contamination from pathogens within every surgical procedure.
- Teamwork: Surgical Technologists will use strong teamwork skills to effectively communicate, resolve conflicts, and make decisions.

Laboratory Skills, Competencies and Exams

This Program has mandatory lab skills, competencies, and exams that must be passed prior to going to clinical. Lab is within SURGT1101: Surgical Technology Concepts I course. Each competency within the course is graded and students must receive a 70% or above in Lab in order to pass SURGT1101

Non-Discrimination Policy:

Criminal Background Check Information

All students will have to complete a NEW Background Check, regardless of when you may have completed the Central Sterile Processing program.

All health care workers and student health care workers are required to undergo a criminal background check in order to work in a clinical setting. A student with a positive background check containing disqualifying conditions as defined by Federal and State law will not be allowed to enter the clinical portion of the program. A student with a positive background check containing disqualifying conditions as defined by Illinois State Law ([225ILCS46/25](#)) and 77 Ill Adm. Code 955 Section [955.160](#) will not be allowed to enter the clinical portion of this program, thus preventing the student from obtaining mandated certification and/or licensure.

NOTE: You may have been convicted and not sent to jail. People are often fined or given probation or conditional discharge rather than jail time, but these are still considered convictions. If you are unsure as to whether an arrest resulted in a conviction, contact the county in which you were arrested and speak to a representative in the Circuit Clerk's office, State's Attorney's office or your attorney.

Statement of Health

Please do not complete these requirements until you are instructed to do so. Once accepted, the health requirements must be completed prior to clinical start dates. Students will need to ensure that all of health requirements, Background Check, and Drug Test are up to date. You will need to complete an updated Chart Review through Edward Corporate Health. You will need to upload your updated health records to your [CastleBranch.com](https://www.castlebranch.com) Profile account. Please see the [health requirement packet](#). Students with chronic medical problems or physical limitations, such as back or knee problems, must have these conditions specifically addressed on the forms, including any restrictions and current medications the student is required to take for health maintenance. For all students, the physician must indicate whether the student's health status will allow them to safely pursue the educational objectives of the program to which they have applied and/or have registered. The health examination and vaccinations are completed at the student's expense.

If applicants do not submit the necessary paperwork, do not obtain the required examinations and vaccinations, and/or are unable to obtain clearance to participate in all the program's clinical activities, without restrictions and/or precautions, they may be considered ineligible for the program and can be withdrawn from the program courses in which they are registered.

Mandatory Drug Testing: Policy and Procedures

Health Career students with direct patient contact must be drug-tested annually prior to clinical experience in every program at the student's expense. All students will need to complete a drug test through [CastleBranch.com](https://www.castlebranch.com) regardless of when you completed Central Sterile Processing.

Statement on Medical Care and Health Insurance

Students are responsible for their own medical care and health insurance while in the program. Students must possess health care insurance in order to train at the clinical affiliate. The student is responsible for any costs that may be incurred related to personal injuries he/she may acquire while performing activities at the clinical affiliate. Statement on Medical Malpractice Insurance

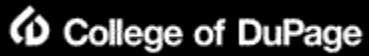
