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## General Requirements for All Associate Degrees

1. Complete at least 64 semester hours of credit in courses numbered 1000 or above for each degree.
2 Possessaminimum 2.00 ("C")average inboth College of DuPage coursework and the combined grade pointaverage of allCollege of DuPage courses numbered 1000 and above and all courses accepted for transfer from otherinstitutions.
2. Complete a minimum of 20 semester hours of applicable degree credit at College of DuPage.
3. Students who break enrollment for more than three consecutive semesters are subject to the degree requirements as stated in the_ College of DuPageCatalog that is current at the time of re-entry. Students who are covered under a catalog prior to fall 2015 should consult with a counselor or adviser.
4. Earn no more than 4 semester credits from Physical Education activity courses.
5. Earnno more than 42 semester credits by demonstrated competence through the Advanced Placement Program (AP) the subject examinations of the CollegeLevel Examination Program (CLEP) and the College of DuPage Proficiency Through an Instructor Program.
6. Submitan Application for a Degree or Certificate no sooner than one term before expected completion of requirements.
7. Satisfy all financial and other specific requirements.
8. Beingood standing at the time final credits for the degree are earned.

## Additional A.A.S. Degree Requirements

1. Select courses to complete the required minimum of 64 semester hours from General Education courses, Elective courses, and Career Technical Education courses.
2 Select a specific Career Technical Educational program and complete the required courses and the minimum number of Career Technical Education credit hours as specified by College of DuPage. The minimum number of Career Technical Education credits required for an AAS degree varies with each program, but at least 20 semester credits (or equivalent) are required.
2. Complete at least two credits from the Global/Multicultural Studies or Contemporary Life Skills category. Countthese credits in General Education, Program Requirements, Program Electives or General Electives, whichever applies.
3. Earn no more than 12 semester credits in courses graded satisfactory/fail.
4. Earn no more than 16 semester credits in courses numbered 1800 or 2800 , 1840 or 2840,1820 to 1829 , and 2820 to 2829 , or labeled as independent study, experimental/pilot, selected topics or field/experiential.

## Associate in Applied Science (AAS) Degree Requirements

This degree represents completion of aCareer Technical Education program of study. Students earning this degree generally seek employment following graduation. Someprograms transfer to baccalaureate institutions in Capstone or $2+2$ or $3+1$ arrangements and/or as part of a non-traditional bachelor's degree program.
