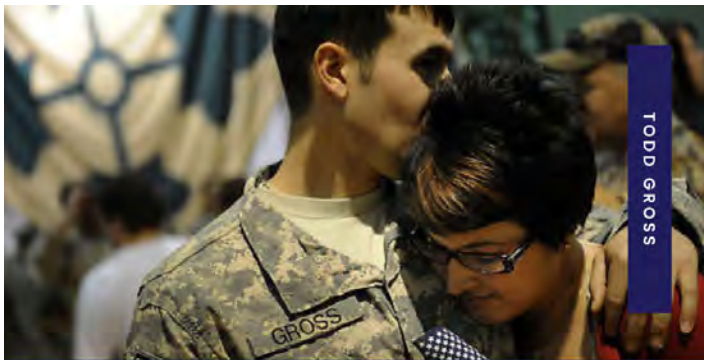


VETERAN SPOTLIGHT
